ARTS & CULTURE SECTOR'S PERCENTAGE OF U.S. ECONOMY (Artists, University Arts, Commercial & Nonprofit Arts Organizations Combined)

ARTS & CULTURE SECTOR REPRESENTS 4.5% OF NATION'S GDP & 5.1 MILLION JOBS

The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis reports that nationally the arts and culture sector is a **\$878 billion industry**, representing 4.5% of the nation's GDP- a larger share of the economy than construction or education services.

NEVADA ARTS & CULTURE SECTOR REPRESENTS 5.5% OF STATE'S GDP & 40,911 JOBS

The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis reports that the arts and culture sector contributes \$8.7 billion to Nevada's economy, representing 5.5% of the state's GDP- a larger share than some other industries in the state.

LOSS OF REVENUE AND JOBS (Commercial & Nonprofit Arts Organizations Combined)

Nationally, COVID-19 has devastated creative economy businesses with a loss of **\$150 billion** in revenue. In addition, creative workers made up **52% of the unemployed population** (2.7 million people) through July 2020.

In Nevada, COVID-19 has devastated creative economy businesses with a loss of **\$1.3 billion** in revenue. In addition, creative workers made up **64% of the Nevada unemployed population** (26,104 people) through July 2020.

UNEMPLOYMENT

ECONOMIC IMPACT OF NONPROFIT ARTS ORGANIZATIONS & THEIR AUDIENCES

Nationally, the nonprofit arts industry alone generates **\$166.3 billion in** economic activity annually that supports 4.6 million jobs and generates **\$27.5** billion in federal, state, and local government revenue.

• Spending by arts audiences generated **\$102.5 billion** to local businesses.

NONPROFIT ART IS A

DRIVER OF OUR NATIONAL STATE & LOCAL ECONOMY.

In 2015, nonprofit arts organizations in the state generated **\$471.1 million** in economic activity annually that supported 10,494 jobs and generated **\$38.8 million** in state and local government revenue.

• In **Reno** specifically, nonprofit arts groups generated **\$50.1 million** in economic activity. Audiences of 1.3 million people added another **\$38.9 million** in related spending for a total of **\$89.0 million** for the city in 2015, and this generated **\$8.0 million** in local and state government revenues.

PUBLIC INVESTMENT IN GRANTS TO NONPROFIT ARTS ORGANIZATIONS & ARTISTS

So how much is the federal government investing in the **National Endowment for the Arts (NEA)?**


Congress allocated **\$167.5 million** to the NEA in FY 2021, which has been relatively level for the last several years. This amounts to just 51¢ per capita, yet the nonprofit arts industry generates over \$13 billion in federal tax revenue back to the U.S. Treasury. Imagine what nonprofit arts groups could generate with \$1 per capita.

What about Nevada—how much does state government budget to the Nevada Arts Council each year?

In **FY 20-21**, the state allocated **\$1,075,797** to the Nevada Arts Council. The Nevada Arts Council also received \$752,100 in federal NEA funds, which the Council re-granted to dozens of cultural organizations throughout the state. Another **17** nonprofit arts organizations received direct grants from the NEA totaling **\$615,000**.

THE ARTS ARE EVERYWHERE!

- Start in **Reno** for A.V.A. Ballet, the Nevada Museum of Art, the Cordillera International Film Festival, the Pioneer Center for the Performing Arts, and Artown, a month-long summer festival that brings in the best performers for 500 events in venues throughout the city. Sierra Arts Foundation and the Reno Philharmonic also have a large impact on community involvement and arts education in the region.
- Northeast of Reno is the **Black Rock Desert**, the site of the Burning Man Festival, the famous experiment in community building, artistic self expression, and giftgiving.
- East of the desert is Elko, proud of its cowboy heritage. The town is home to the state's oldest rodeo, the National Cowboy Poetry Gathering, and the National Basque Festival, which features traditional Basque music, food, arts, and crafts.
- Head south of Reno to Carson City for the Wild Horse Children's Theater, the Jazz & Beyond Music Festival, the BreweryArts Center for art galleries, concerts, classic movies, and classes in painting, photography, and pottery.
- In Genoa, don't miss the Genoa Candy Dance & Faire for its 300 artists and 4,000 pounds of homemade candy!
- Then head to Las Vegas for the Contemporary Arts Center, the Bellagio Gallery of Fine Arts, and the Smith Center for the Performing Arts. In September, don't miss the Harvest Festival, with tens of thousands handmade art and crafts, all day entertainment, and an activity center for kids.
