ARTS & CULTURE SECTOR'S PERCENTAGE OF U.S. ECONOMY (Artists, University Arts, Commercial & Nonprofit Arts Organizations Combined)

ARTS & CULTURE SECTOR REPRESENTS 4.2% OF NATION'S GDP & 4.6 MILLION JOBS

U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis reports that nationally the arts and culture sector was a \$876.7 billion industry in 2020, representing 4.2% of the nation's GDP, **4.6 million jobs**, and total compensation of **\$446 billion**.

NM ARTS & CULTURE SECTOR REPRESENTS 2.6% OF STATE'S GDP & 21,523 JOBS

U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis reports that the arts and culture sector contributed \$2.5 billion to NM's economy in 2020, representing 2.6% of the state's GDP, **21,523 jobs**, and total compensation of **\$1.4 billion**.

BONUS: In 2020, NM arts and culture was also larger than the Agriculture industry.

LOSS OF REVENUE AND JOBS (Commercial & Nonprofit Arts Organizations Combined)

Between 2019 and 2020, the U.S. arts economy shrank at nearly twice **the rate** of the economy as a whole. Arts and cultural production fell by **6.4%** when adjusted for inflation, compared with a **3.4%** decline overall.

NM arts and culture value added decreased by 14% between 2019 and 2020. In addition, arts & culture employment decreased by **18%**, dropping from 26.373 to 21.523.

ECONOMIC IMPACT OF NONPROFIT ARTS ORGANIZATIONS & THEIR AUDIENCES

Nationally, the nonprofit arts industry alone generates **\$166.3 billion in** economic activity annually that supports 4.6 million jobs and generates **\$27.5** billion in federal, state, and local government revenue.

• Spending by arts audiences generated **\$102.5 billion** to local businesses.

NONPROFIT **ART** IS A

DRIVER OF OUR NATIONAL, STATE & LOCAL ECONOMY.

In 2015, New Mexico's arts and culture sector **employed thousands of** FTE jobs and generated millions of dollars in economic activity. Nonprofit arts groups helped cultivate that activity.

• In Doña Ana County, for example, nonprofit arts groups generated \$12.9 million in economic activity. Audiences of 661,846 people added another \$20.2 million in related spending for a total of \$33.1 million for the county in 2015, and this generated \$3.4 million in local and state government revenues and 743 FTE jobs.

PUBLIC INVESTMENT IN GRANTS TO NONPROFIT ARTS ORGANIZATIONS & ARTISTS

How much is the federal government investing in the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA)?

Congress allocated **\$180 million** to the NEA in **FY22**. This amounts to just **54 cents** per capita. Ideally, Congress should index \$1 per capita funding to the NEA. For COVID economic relief, Congress also allocated **\$75 million** in CARES Act and **\$135 million** in ARPA funding for distribution by the NEA. Additionally, Congress allocated **\$16 billion** to the SBA for shuttered arts venues plus billions more for PPP and EIDL.

How much did New Mexico receive in public funding for the arts and culture?

In **FY22** the state allocated **\$1,418,000** to New Mexico Arts. We also received **\$771,200** in federal NEA funds, we regranted to dozens of cultural organizations throughout the state. In addition, NM Arts received an addition **\$770,000** in federal NEA funds as part of the American Rescue Plan which will be distributed to non-profit arts and cultural organizations across the state to support pandemic recovery efforts. Another 35 non-profit arts organizations received direct grants from the NEA totaling \$1,730,000.

Every year, New Mexico Arts financially supports between six and eight Folk Art Apprentice/Master pairs to sustain traditional folk arts practiced in New Mexico by contracting with master artists to teach their art forms to dedicated apprentices.

THE ARTS ARE EVERYWHERE!

- Most people start their adventure in **Albuquerque** in the center of the state. Don't miss the City's Albuquerque Museum or 516 Arts, a noncollecting, non-profit contemporary art museum or take in dinner and a performance at the **National Hispanic Cultural Center or the Indian Pueblo Cultural Center**
- Head south from Albuquerque to sunny Las Cruces, and visit the New Mexico State University's Art **Museum** and incredible public art collection they have on campus with their self-guided walking tour. While on campus, check out the NMSU's gorgeous performing arts center.
- Just about two hours northwest of Las Cruces in the renowned arts town, Silver City. Named one of the "100 Best Art Towns in America" by arts writer John Villani, you'll find a plethora of galleries, murals, and arts & culture venues nestled at the southern foot of the Pinos Altos Range of the Mogollon Mountains.
- An hour north of Albuquerque is **Santa Fe**, the oldest state capitol in the country and a small city widely hailed as an arts mecca. From large contemporary arts venues like **Site Santa Fe** to dozens of small non-profit arts spaces to world-class museums or performance venues like the **Museum of International Folk Art** and the **Santa Fe Opera**, you will be immersed in the arts.
- From Santa Fe, all roads lead to the arts. If you head west, you'll find **Gallup**, a center of Native American arts and culture and home to **gallupARTS** serving McKinley County. If you head due north to Española, make sure to visit the **Española Fiber Arts Center** to learn about the deep history of fiber arts in New Mexico. Keep heading north and you'll come to **Taos**, an arts epicenter packed with museums and galleries. Three hours southeast of Santa Fe is Roswell, not only home to aliens, but to the **Anderson Museum** housing work from 45 years of the famed Roswell Artist in Residence Program.
