2022 marks a midterm election year, which means all 435 U.S. House of Representatives, 6 Delegates, and one-third of the U.S. Senate are running for election on **Tuesday, November 8, 2022**. There will likely be state and local elections taking place that day as well.

About the 2022 Congressional Arts Report Card

The Arts Action Fund PAC's 2022 Congressional Arts Report Card is an analysis and scorecard of how current incumbent Congressional candidates took pro-arts actions over the last two years. This document serves as your one-stop review of pro-arts actions taken or not taken by incumbents before you cast your vote at the ballot box. We evaluated **14 legislative arts indicators in the House** and **10 indicators in the Senate**. These arts indicators range from Co-Sponsoring important arts policy legislation to signing on to "Dear Colleague" letters with their peers in the House and the Senate to show group support for the arts. Those Members who co-sponsored the Save Our Stages legislation, signed on to a Dear Colleague letter to increase funding for NEA/NEH, or earned extra credit for phenomenal leadership either behind the scenes or publicly, were awarded an automatic thumbs up $\$ on our Report Card. Members of Congress also earned a thumbs up $\$ if they participated in any two of the other arts indicators with a pro-arts position, as represented by a filled-in dot $\$.

The Arts Have Strong Bipartisan Support in Congress

While the COVID-19 pandemic wreaked havoc on families, businesses, and the entire world, it was also an opportunity to see our legislators come together on a bipartisan level to prevent the infrastructure for the arts from crumbling in this country. Unprecedented legislation was passed to support creative gig workers, entrepreneurs, and nonprofit arts organizations with billions of dollars in Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC), Paycheck Protection Program (PPP forgivable loans), COVID Emergency Disaster Loans (EIDL) and Advances, additional grant-making funds for the National Endowments for the Arts (NEA) and Humanities (NEH), and Small Business Administration grants for Shuttered Venue Operator Grants (SVOG aka Save Our Stages). The numbers speak for themselves: 253 House members (57%) received a Thumbs Up and 71 Senate members (71%) received a thumbs up & in our Congressional Arts Report Card this year. We are grateful to the many Republicans and Democrats, who partnered together to spearhead groundbreaking arts legislation, like Senators John Cornyn (R-TX) and Amy Klobuchar (D-MN) and Representatives Peter Welch (D-VT) and Roger Williams (R-TX), as well as congressional leaders Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) and Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer (D-NY).

HOUSE ARTS LEADERSHIP EXTRA CREDIT FOR ADDITIONAL REASONS

Rep. Mark Amodei (R-NV) serves on the House Interior Appropriations Subcommittee and showed support for NEA/NEH at the FY'23 hearing.

Rep. Suzanne Bonamici (D-OR) serves as Co-Chair of Congressional STEAM Caucus, and led the "Dear Colleague" letters in support of the NEA/NEH.

Rep. Catherine Clark (D-MA) serves on Labor-HHS-Education Appropriations Subcommittee and the 2020 Democratic Policy Platform Committee, which included an arts and arts education policy position.

Rep. Alexandra Ocasio-Cortez (D- NY) was an original Co-Sponsor of H. Res. 918, honoring the Harlem Renaissance legacy as a cultural, social, and political movement in American history.

Rep. Peter DeFazio (D-OR) led efforts to successfully preserve the STAR Act in the House Infrastructure package. However, the provision was stripped in the Senate.

Rep. Steny Hoyer (D-MD) is the House Democratic Leader who galvanizes support for the arts, including the successful passage of the Save Our Stages Act.

Rep. Hakeem Jefferies (D-NY) founded and hosts the annual Hip Hop on the Hill event on Capitol Hill.

Rep. David Joyce (R-OH) serves on the House Interior Appropriations Subcommittee and showed support for NEA/NEH at the FY'23 hearing.

Rep. Betty McCollum (D-MN) actively supports Save America's Treasures program, preserving nationally significant collections and historic properties.

Rep. Kweisi Mfume (D-MD) sponsored <u>H.R. 6931</u>, the Baltimore National Heritage Area Reauthorization Act, supporting the Baltimore National Heritage Area in Maryland through March 30, 2036.

Rep. Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) is Speaker of the House and the top advocate for the arts. Her leadership helped enact the Save our Stages Act into law and publicly states that NEA/NEH funding should be indexed to \$1 per capita.

Rep. Chellie Pingree (D-ME) serves as the lead Co-Chair of the Congressional Arts Caucus and is the ex-officio Congressional appointee on the National Council on the Arts. She also chairs the House Interior Appropriations Subcommittee and helped secure increases in funding for NEA/NEH.

Rep. David Price (D-NC) serves as the lead Co-Chair of the Congressional Humanities Caucus, where he advances critical pro-arts "Dear Colleague" letters, including support for federal funding for the humanities.

Rep. Maria Salazar (R-FL) co-led with Rep. Bonamici the FY'23 "Dear Colleague" letter in support of the NEA/NEH.

Rep. Mike Simpson (R-ID) is a senior member of the House Interior Appropriations Subcommittee and consistently showed support for NEA initiatives at the FY'23 hearing for NEA/NEH. He also publicly supports indexing NEA/NEH budgets to \$1 per capita for the arts and humanities.

Rep. Elise Stefanik (R-NY) Co-Chairs the Congressional STEAM Caucus and the Congressional Arts Caucus.

Rep. Glenn Thompson (R-PA) is an ex-officio Congressional appointee to the National Council on the Arts.

This legislation authorized the Small Business Administration to make grants to eligible live venue operators, producers, promoters, or talent representatives to address the economic effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on certain live venues.

Cosponsored H.R. 5429, the Save Our Stages Extension Act (SOS Extension). Introduced on September 29, 2021, this bill would extend the time frame during which Shuttered Venue Operators Grant recipients may use grant funds to cover their expenses to March 11, 2023. The original legislation, the Save Our Stages Act, authorized the Small Business Administration to make grants to eligible live venue operators, producers, promoters, or talent representatives to address the economic effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on certain live venues through June 30, 2022. The SOS Extension Act was never passed.

6 Cosigned an <u>FY'23 "Dear Colleague"</u> letter on April 13, 2022, asking House appropriators to support a funding level of "at least" \$204 million for the National Endowment for the Arts in FY'21. The letter was initiated by Congressional STEAM Caucus Co-Chair Rep. Suzanne Bonamici (D-OR) and Rep. Maria Salazar (R-FL).

Cosigned an FY'22 "Dear Colleague" letter on April 30, 2021 asking House appropriators to support a funding level of "at least" \$176 million for the National Endowment for the Arts in FY'20. The letter was initiated by Congressional Arts Caucus Co-Chairs Rep. Suzanne Bonamici (D-OR) and Rep. Elise Stefanik (R-NY).

HOW TO READ THE U.S. HOUSE ARTS SUPPORT INDICATORS*

8 Cosponsored H.R. 4750, the Performing Arts Parity Tax Act (PAPTA) reinstates and updates the Qualified Performing Artist Tax Deduction to allow additional lower and middle-income performing artists to deduct the costs of expenses incurred in the course of their employment. This bill would increase the income ceiling from \$16,000/yr to \$100,000/yr for individuals and to \$200,000/yr for married joint filers. This legislation has not been enacted yet.

9 Cosponsored <u>H.R. 5581</u>, the **Arts Education for All Act**. This legislation would expand arts education and programming for children in early education, K-12 students, and juveniles and adults in the criminal justice system.

Oosponsored <u>H.R. 5019</u>, the **C**reative **E**conomy **R**evitalization **A**ct (**CERA**). This bill would require the Department of Labor to award grants to government and nonprofit agencies to provide programs that employ individuals and provide public access to art or arts programming.

Osponsored <u>H.R. 7627</u>, the **Advancing Equity Through the Arts and Humanities Act**. This bill would create a program under the National Endowment for the Arts and the National Endowment for the Humanities to provide grants to increase engagement with public and nonprofit entities, including faith-based and community-based organizations, that serve and are led by people of color and support projects that combat racism.

Cosponsored <u>H.R. 6381</u>, the Comprehensive Resources for Entrepreneurs in the Arts to Transform the Economy (CREATE) Act would support artists, entrepreneurs, and workers in growing their businesses, accessing federal SBA resources and funding, and expanding their networks with local communities.

Oosponsored <u>H.R 6569</u>, the Promoting Local Arts and Creative Economy Workforce Act (PLACE). The bill would empower creative workers, help foster growth in new and existing businesses, and promote the export of American culture abroad by focusing on the creative economy across government agencies.
