- Start in Omaha for a variety of performing arts and museum experiences, including Omaha Performing Arts, El Museo Latino, the BLUEBARN Theatre, and KANEKO.
- Just to the west is the idyllic hamlet, **Ashland**. Stroll the art galleries, restaurants and boutiques in the Flora District; Nebraska's first certified Creative District.
- Travel north to Norfolk for the Great American Comedy Festival at the Johnny Carson Theatre every June or visit anytime to enjoy the downtown murals, sculpture walk, and the Norfolk Arts Center.

- The capitol city area of Lincoln offers a variety of arts experiences, including exhibitions at the LUX Center for the Arts, the annual Lincoln Arts Festival, and many multicultural events throughout the year.
- Visiting the center of the state brings you to the center of art events and activities coordinated by the Kearney Cultural Partnership.
- The halfway point to St. Patrick's Day is always a celebration at the Greeley Irish Festival.
- Red Cloud is a destination for culture enthusiasts as the hometown of author Willa Cather; take in a show or exhibit at the Red Cloud Opera House and visit the National Willa Cather Center.

- The North Platte Canteen was the nation's stop for traveling WWll soldiers; now travelers stop to enjoy the activities at the Prairie Arts Center and the Neville Center for Performing Arts.
- Travel to Valley County, in the heart of Central Nebraska, and experience The Golden Husk Theatre, the Main Street Gallery, historical sites, town festivals, a craft brewery, and a rich array of talented artists.
- Scottsbluff is a hub of creativity through the Midwest Theatre and the West Nebraska Arts Center.
